CLEANING GUIDE FABRICS, VINYL, MESH AND LEATHER



CLEANING GUIDE

BOUTY chairs are made of top-quality materials that ensure the durability of the product. However, constant maintenance is required to ensure its longevity. It should be noted that intensive use may require more frequent maintenance.

When using a cleaning product, it is strongly recommended to test a small inconspicuous area to verify the stability of the colors before cleaning the entire stain.

LET'S BE ECO-RESPONSIBLE

In order to reduce the impact of the use of cleaning products on our environment, we suggest using Green Seal, EcoLogo or Ecocert certified products.

We also encourage you to observe the following procedures:

- · Reduce the amount of chemicals used during cleaning.
- Use high particulate filtration vacuums to trap airborne particles and prevent them from affecting indoor air quality.
- Use cleaning products that have low levels of dyes and fragrances.
- Some dyes can stain fabrics.
- · Choose biodegradable cleaning products.
- · Avoid using products with ammonia or alcohol.







UPHOLSTERIES

Polyester

This fabric is resistant to most cleaning solvents. For small stains, use mild soap and water, then rinse with water and dry with a lint-free cloth.

If there are oil or grease stains, these will respond to a mild or dry solvent such as Formula 409® or Fantastik®. Rinse with water and dry.

Stain build-up can be removed with a mild detergent or furniture cleaner. Rinse well with a clean sponge to remove traces of the water-based cleaner. Please note that this fabric dries very quickly.

Vinyl

Remove dirt and stains with a mixture of mild soap and warm water. Use a cloth to clean the area, rinse with water and dry with a lint-free cloth. A soft bristle brush may be necessary to remove dirt from crevices.

Do not use abrasives or steel wool as this may damage the surface. Do not use solvent-based cleaners. The Premier collection upholsteries can be cleaned with Virox 5, PCS sodium hypochlorite and Triad III.

Polyurethane

Use a mixture of mild soap and warm water to clean the surfaces of chairs. You can rub the stained area with a cloth.

For dirt that is embedded in the grain of the surface, use a soft brush. If necessary, use some cleaning powder. Always rinse and dry with a cloth.

Leather

Leather is a natural product and requires very little care during use. Most stains can be removed with a clean, dry cloth.

For general care, remove dust from the surface of the leather as you would on furniture. For tougher stains, use a mild detergent, rinse well and air-dry.

Never use abrasive products, oils, varnishes or ammonia on leather. Some cleaning products may cause discoloration and should be tested in an inconspicuous area before use.

Woolen fabrics

Dry cleaning (with solvents) is the preferred method of getting rid of stains. Oil, grease, dirt and usual stains should respond to gentle cleaning with a dry solvent. Use a blotting technique.

Over-scrubbing the fabric can lead to abrasion of the surface.
